Please find overleaf an outline of the revision sessions being offered by the History Department in the lead up to your son/daughter's GCSE examinations.

### **Revision**

We have found in recent years that students who have attended the revision sessions in order to supplement the learning that we do in lessons tend to be more successful in their exams.

We have arranged the sessions so that students can attend at lunchtime or after school (or preferably both). We have also listed the topics of each session in order to help students manage their time and efforts in this busy period.

As you will see, we are also offering '*Revision Workshops*' in the lead up to each exam. The details of the times of these will be advertised nearer the time they are a superb opportunity for students to add to their notes and be refreshed on exam technique. Students who attended similar sessions last year found them hugely beneficial.

### **Practice Questions**

History students are examined over three papers. In order to ensure that students are as comfortable as possible with the technique and requirements of the exam papers, we are happy to mark any practice questions that students complete whilst they are revising the different topics. We have a range of questions printed in the department ready for students to collect if they would like to test themselves and their knowledge.

We promise that if students complete a practice question and hand it in, they will receive it back marked and with feedback 24 hours later.

### **Workshops**

We will be running some other sessions targeted at students that want to achieve a grade 5 or a grade 9 in History – these sessions are focusing on each exam in turn. They will be short sessions that will drill down on technique and methods to be successful in the exams. Students will be invited separately to attend these sessions in the summer term.
